- 2. Mathematics
- 3. Science

### **Educational Programs**



#### • Special Education

Continuum of services that align with students' I.E.P.s.

#### • ESOL (Multilingual Learners)

- Courses support students with a home language other than English.
- Placements are based on W.I.D.A. scores.

#### Literacy Support Courses

 Students may be placed in a literacy support course based on their reading test data. Parents/guardians are notified over the summer.

#### **International Baccalaureate**





**All students** in grades 7–10 at Langston Hughes and South Lakes participate.

## Students interested in IB should take:

 Algebra and a World Language by the end of 8th grade.

 Honors or AAP classes are the best preparation for the IB Diploma classes in high school.

#### **Advanced Courses**



- Honors courses open to all students:
  - Honors English 8
  - Honors Science 8
  - Honors Civics 8
  - Algebra 1 Honors
  - Honors Geometry (Prerequisite: Algebra 1)
- AAP (Advanced Academics)
  - Students who are identified as level IV are automatically enrolled in AAP English, AAP Science, and AAP Civics.


- Are you passionate about the subject?

### **World Language Courses**




- All 8th grade World Language courses are full year, high school credit courses (\*).
  - The final grade will be on your high school transcript and be calculated in your **GPA** (Grade Point Average).
- Taking a World Language course is like taking another core class; expect more homework and rigor.
- Take a World Language class in 8th grade if you are interested in the IB Diploma.

#### **Elective Options**






Students have two periods in their schedule for electives.
