What is New in 8th Grade?

- Students have more opportunities to earn high school credits.
- Students take 3 SOLs:
 - Reading
 - Math
 - Science
- Increased academic expectations to prepare students for high school.
- Advanced elective course options are available.
- FCPS <u>Summer Learning</u> opportunities are available.
- Students should earn 15 service learning hours by the end of 8th grade.
 - Do not go to an elementary school without pre-arranging it with a specific teacher.

Course Options


- All students take Honors Civics.
- Honors courses open to all students:
 - Honors English 8
 - Honors Science 8
 - Algebra 1 Honors
- Honors Geometry requires successful completion of Algebra 1.
- AAP (Advanced Academics)
 - Students who are identified as level IV are automatically enrolled in AAP English, AAP Science, and AAP Civics.

Elective Options



Students have two periods in their schedule for electives.

Students may be placed in a reading or math elective based on their SOL scores.

World Language

- All 8th grade World Language courses are full year, high school credit courses.
 - The final grade will be on your high school transcript and be calculated in your **GPA** (Grade Point Average).
- Taking a World Language course is like taking another core class; expect more homework and rigor.
- Take a World Language class in 8th grade if you are interested in the IB Diploma.






Engineering
